### **SECTION I: VEGETABLES AND FRUIT**

***The Neville Hames Cup – most points in section***  
***The Ginger and Pickles Shield - best exhibit in section***

1. Dish of 5 potatoes, 1 variety
2. 5 onions, trimmed and not skinned, 1 variety
3. Bunch of 3 carrots, 1 variety
4. 2 heads lettuce, 1 variety with washed roots
5. 3 courgettes, maximum 15cm
6. 3 beetroot, round and untrimmed
7. 8 French beans
8. 8 pods of mangetout or sugar snap peas
9. 8 pods of peas
10. A collection of culinary herbs in water, 4 distinct kinds, maximum of 12 stems  
(refer to “Useful Show Notes” on page 13)
11. Any other vegetable (refer to page 14 for quantities and points)
12. A collection of 3 kinds of vegetables, space allotted 60cms (refer to page 14  
for quantities and points.) **No late entries**
13. A collection of vegetables, 4 distinct kinds, one of each in a basket  
(not exceeding 38 cm overall) refer to page 14 for quantities and points
14. 12 gooseberries, plate will be provided
15. 6 strigs of blackcurrants, plate will be provided
16. 6 strigs of redcurrants, plate will be provided
17. 12 raspberries, plate will be provided
18. Any other fruits (refer to page 14 for quantities)

***The Banting Memorial Bowl - best exhibit in section***

19. 1 specimen rose, large flowered
20. 1 specimen rose, large flowered, any variety, judged for fragrance only
21. A vase of 3 roses, large flowered, 1 or more varieties
22. A vase of cluster-flowered roses, 3 stems, 1 or more varieties
23. 3 stems small flowered rose, patio or miniature type (one or more varieties,  
flowers not to exceed 50mm in diameter)
24. A vase of one kind of annual, not more than 12 stems
25. 1 begonia bloom **in own container**
26. 1 specimen stem, other than a rose
27. A vase of 1 kind of flower not specified above (biennial or

- perennial, not shrubs or trees)
28. A vase of mixed garden flowers, not more than 12 stems
  29. A vase of sweet peas, mixed, 5 stems with own foliage
  30. A vase of mixed herbaceous perennials, to be judged on quality and effect
  31. A vase of flowering shrubs and /or trees, 1 or more kinds

### **SECTION III: PLANTS**

The Henry Bone Begonia Cup – best exhibit in Class 33***

32. 1 pot fuchsia (pot not to exceed 25 cm)
33. 1 double tuberous begonia in a pot (pot not to exceed 25 cm)
34. 1 pot pelargonium - flowering (pot not to exceed 25 cm)
35. A flowering pot plant grown from seed within the last 12 months
36. Any other pot plant, foliage
37. A pot of lilies - one or more varieties (pot not to exceed 38 cm)

The cut ends of living plant material must be in water or water retaining material.

An exhibit is plant material with or without accessories.

## VICTORIA SPONGE RECIPE

**225g / (8oz) soft margarine**

**225g / (8oz) caster sugar**

**4 eggs**

**2 tsp baking powder**

**225g (8oz) self raising flour**

**For the Filling: About 4tbsp raspberry jam and a little caster sugar.**

- Pre- heat oven to 180/350/Gas 4.
- Grease and base line 2 x20cm(8in) sandwich tins with greased greaseproof paper.
- Measure margarine, caster sugar, eggs, flour and baking

- powder into large bowl and beat well, thoroughly blending.
- Divide mixture evenly between both tins and level out.
  - Bake in a pre-heated oven for about 25mins or until well risen and top of cakes spring back when pressed.
  - Leave to cool in the tins
  - for few moments and then turn out, peel off paper and leave to finish cooling on wire rack.
  - When completely cold, sandwich cakes together with the jam. Sprinkle top of cake with caster sugar to serve.

### **SPECIAL PRIZES**

Trophies to be held for one year and must be returned to the General Secretary not less than 6 weeks before the date of the next show. In the event of a tie for the first place each competitor will hold the trophy for a proportionate part of the year.
